2023 highlights:

- Murray's first title of 2023 came in the ATP Challenger event in Aix-en-Provence, beating Tommy Paul 26 61 62 in May.
- He enjoyed an impressive run to the final of Qatar Open, losing to Daniil Medvedev.
- Thrilling performances at Australian Open included five-set wins over Matteo Berrettini and Thanasi Kokkinakis.

Career highlights:

- Runner-up in the 2013 Wimbledon Boys' Singles, beating Nick Kyrgios during his run to the final.
- Won 70+ percent of matches on ATP Challenger Tour (84-27) and ITF Junior Circuit (84-32).
- Won the 2017 ATP Next Gen Finals, beating Andrey Rublev in the final.
- Enjoyed a breakthrough 2018 Australian Open, beating Alexander Zverev and Novak Djokovic en-route to the semi-finals.
- Achieved career-high No.19 on 2 April 2018.
- Did not compete on the ATP Tour in 2021 or 2022 due to injury.
- Made his return to action on the ATP Challenger Tour last month in Seoul.

2023 highlights:

- In his first ATP Challenger event of the year, Peniston made it to the semi-finals at the Noumea Challenger event before having to withdraw from his match against France's Laurent Lokoli due to injury.
- Peniston got off to a flying start in February, making it all the way to the semi-final of the Tenerife Challenger 3 event where, he faced Stefano Travaglia. Unfortunately, Peniston just lost out on a place in the final after a 76(4) 26 62 defeat to the Italian.

Career highlights:

- Achieved career-high No. 35 in 2015 after breaking into Top 100 at age 19 in 2013 and ending that season as youngest player in Top 100.
- Defeated World No. 1 Djokovic at 2016 ATP Masters 1000 Monte Carlo and 2022 Dubai, joining Marat Safin as only players to defeat Djokovic multiple times with no losses.
- Advanced to Wimbledon 4R in 2016 and 2018, losing five-set match to his idol and countryman Thomas Berdych in 2016.
- He has reached the third round or better at all for major tournaments.
- Was sidelined for 8 months after 2022 US Open until coming back in April 2023 at Ostrava Challenger
