The ATP Challenger Tour is the second-highest level of men's professional tennis in the world. Since its inception in 1978, competition on the tour has been intense, with players fighting for critical ATP Rankings points and prize money.

These tournaments (more than 180 events in 40 countries) give fans the excitement of watching world-class tennis in a smaller, more intimate setting.

LAUNCHPAD OF LEGENDS



A GLOBAL GAME

The ATP Challenger Tour visits some of the most scenic locales in the world, with beachfront tournaments in Saint-Tropez, France and Puerto Vallarta, Mexico, the picturesque mountain towns of Como, Italy and Quito, Ecuador, and bustling cities of Buenos Aires, Seoul and Vancouver.

The circuit also travels to historic locations, including a 130-year-old club in Heilbronn, Germany and a dozen others that were founded before 1900.
