KATIE SWAN (GBR) v LILY MIYAZAKI (GER)

Head to Head: Miyazaki leads 1-0

Previous meeting: 2022 ITF World Tennis Tour W60 Glasgow, indoor hard court - Miyazaki won 46 64 62.

Career highlights:

- Swan came through two rounds of qualifying to take her place in the main draw for the Indian Wells events in March.
- She played three matches for Great Britain in the United Cup in January, beating world No.70 Nuria Parrizas Dias in that event.
- She has won 12 singles titles on the ITF World Tennis Tour.
- Swan is aiming to make it through to her first ITF World Tennis Tour W100 final today.
- Her best ranking win of 2023 came against world No.69 Camila Giorgi in qualifying for the Lyon Open in January.
- She is the youngest player to represent Great Britain in the Billie Jean King Cup, playing against South Africa in 2016 aged 16 years and 316 days.

Career highlights:

- Won ITF World Tennis Tour W60 Glasgow last October, beating Britain's Heather Watson in the Final.
- She added a second ITF World Tour W60 title to her record by winning the [All Japan Indoor Championships](#) last December.
- Played in her first Grand Slam qualifying at the 2022 Australian Open.
- Won two ITF singles titles and three doubles titles in 2021.
- Miyazaki is aiming to make it through to her first ITF World Tennis Tour W100 final today.
- Her highest ranking win in 2023 was against world no.143 Jang Su-jeong from South Korea in qualifying for the Australian Open.

KATIE BOULTER (GBR) v YANINA WICKMAYER (BEL)

Head to Head: Boulter leads 2-0

Previous meeting: 2022 ITF World Tennis Tour W100 Shrewsbury last November - Boulter won 75 75.

Career highlights:

- Boulter kicked off her year by winning the seventh ITF title of her career at the [W60 Canberra](#) event.
- She was selected to represent Great Britain in their Billie Jean King Cup qualifying tie against France at the Coventry Building Society Arena.
- Boulter blitzed through to the final at the W80 Gifu tournament last month, where she was beaten in the final by Japan's Himeno Sakatsume. It was the biggest singles' final to date in her career. Boulter then made it through to another ITF W60 Final a week later, withdrawing due to injury.
- Her biggest rankings win of 2023 came against world No.110 Daria Snigur in the qualifying rounds at Indian Wells in March.

- At Wimbledon last year, Boulter upset world No.6 and 2021 Wimbledon finalist Karolina Pliskova.

Career highlights:

- Achieved a career high ranking of No.12 in April 2010, currently ranked No.140.
- Her best run in a Grand Slam event came at the 2009 US Open, where she reached the semi-finals and was beaten by Caroline Wozniacki.
- Her best run at Wimbledon was in 2011, when she reached the fourth round.
- Wickmayer has won two ITF World Tennis Tour titles this season, including W100 Trnava last month.
- In April 2021, Wickmayer gave birth to her first child, daughter Luana Daniëlla.

ANDY MURRAY (GBR) v JORDAN THOMPSON (AUS)

2023 highlights:

- Murray's first title of 2023 came in the ATP Challenger event in Aix-en-Provence, beating Tommy Paul [26 61 62](#) in May.
- He enjoyed an impressive run to the final of Qatar Open in February, losing to Daniil Medvedev.
- Murray produced some thrilling performances at Australian Open, including five-set wins over Matteo Berrettini and Thanasi Kokkinakis.
- Murray's best ranking win of 2023 came against world No.13 Matteo Berrettini in the Australian Open first round.

Career highlights:

- He is defending [Surbiton Trophy champion](#) after winning last year's final against Denis Kudla.
- Thompson won last month's ATP Challenger in Gwangju, South Korea, beating world No.89 Max Purcell in the final.
- He also won an ATP Challenger event staged in Georgia, USA, in February.
- Beat world No.3 Stefanos Tsitsipas to reach the last-32 at this year's Indian Wells Masters.
- He has won 11 ATP Challenger titles and lost to Britain's Dan Evans in the final of last year's ATP Challenger in Nottingham.
