CINCH CHAMPIONSHIPS TALKING POINTS

- Three former champions return to **cinch Championships** including World No. 2 **Carlos Alcaraz**, who went 12-0 on grass last year capturing titles at Queen's Club and Wimbledon. He is joined by 5-time champion **Andy Murray** and 2014 champion **Grigor Dimitrov**. Last year's finalists return as the Top-2 seeds as reigning champion Alcaraz takes the No. 1 seeding position, while 2023 runner-up **Alex de Minaur** is the No. 2 seed.
- **Alcaraz** is on a 7-match winning streak after capturing his 3rd Grand Slam title at Roland Garros on June 9. Last year, the Spaniard became the youngest champion at the event since **Lleyton Hewitt** in 2000. The 22-year-old now aims to defend his title and join **Matteo Berrettini** (2021-22) as the only players in Open Era to win titles in each of their 1st 2 appearances at **cinch Championships**.
- **Andy Murray**, who owns the tournament record with 5 titles at the Queen's Club, plays in his 16th main draw at the event, tying **Lleyton Hewitt** for most tournament appearances in Open Era. Murray opens against qualifier **Alexei Popyrin** in what will be the 37-year-old Brit's 1000th tour-level match, becoming just the fifth active male player to achieve that feat (Djokovic 1324, Nadal 1300, Verdasco 1006, Gasquet 1004).
- Joining Murray in the draw are four other Brits, including **Jack Draper**, who became the British No. 1 for the first time on Monday at career-high No. 31. 22-year-old Draper enters the draw on a 5-match winning streak after lifting his 1st ATP Tour title in Stuttgart on Sunday. **Cameron Norrie** and wildcards **Billy Harris**, who makes his main draw debut, and **Daniel Evans** round out the British presence in this year's main draw.
- 2021 runner-up **Cameron Norrie** is the only Brit on the schedule on Monday as he faces **Milos Raonic** (2016) in the battle of former finalists. Raonic, who reached the 's-Hertogenbosch QF last week, won both their previous meetings. Also playing on Monday, No. 3 seed **Grigor Dimitrov** opens Centre Court action against **Adrian Mannarino**. The World No. 10 aims to join Cilic (35), Murray (31) and Mahut (20) as the fourth active player to record 20+ main draw wins at Queen's Club.
- Last year's finalist **Alex de Minaur** returns as the No. 2 seed on the back of winning his 2nd grass ATP Tour title in 's-Hertogenbosch last week. de Minaur is 11-2 in ATP 500 events this season, winning the title in Acapulco and reaching the final of Rotterdam on hard courts. He also leads the tour in ATP 500 wins since the start of 2023 season.

Grigor Dimitrov | Age: 33 | World No. 10 | Career-High No. 3 | 2024: 28-9 (Brisbane Title) | Queen's: 19-12 (2014 Title)
 > Former World No. 1 junior ended 2017 at career-high No. 3 after becoming 1st debutant to go 5-0 en route to Nitto ATP Finals title since McEnroe in 1978.

> Top-ranked Bulgarian in history and only champion from his country, winning 9 titles including 2017 ATP Masters 1000 Cincinnati.

> Surpassed 400 wins in September 2023, highlighted by biggest win over No. 1 Djokovic at 2013 ATP Masters 1000 Madrid.

> Advanced to Grand Slam SFs at 2014 Wimbledon, 2017 Australian Open and 2019 US Open, as well as 11 ATP Masters 1000 SFs.

> Posted 1st win in 8 meetings with Federer in 2019 US Open QF as World No. 78, becoming 2nd-lowest-ranked US Open men's semi-finalist in history (No. 174 Connors in 1991).

NOTE: Dimitrov is making his 14th appearance at the event, 10 years after defeating F. Lopez to win the 2014 title. The Bulgarian is 28-3 in his opening rounds since the start of 2023 season, including 9-1 in 2024 (l. to Mensik at ATP Masters 1000 Madrid for lone loss).

Adrian Mannarino | Age: 35 | World No. 21 | Career-High No. 17 | 2024: 8-14 (Dallas SF) | Queen's: 11-9 ('11, '18, '23 QF)
 > Ended 11 straight years in Top 75 of PIF ATP Rankings (2013-23), before breaking into Top 20 at the age of 35, achieving career-high No. 17 in January 2024.

> Captured 1st ATP Tour title in 7th final of career at 2019 's-Hertogenbosch, 2nd title in 11th final of career at 2022 Winston-Salem.

> Posted personal-best 43 wins in 2023, highlighted by ATP Tour titles in Newport, Astana and Sofia.

> Earned first Top 5 win over No. 5 Cilic to reach biggest final of career at 2017 Tokyo and biggest win of career over No. 3 Medvedev at 2023 's-Hertogenbosch.

> Reached Australian Open 4R in 2022 and 2024 and Wimbledon 4R in 2013, 2017 and 2018, but owns 0-22 record vs. Top-10 players at Grand Slams.

NOTE: Mannarino is 10-56 vs. Top 10 in his career (0-3 in 2024), looking for first Top 10 win since defeating No. 8 Fritz in Queen's Club 2R last year. He owns a 70-47 (.598) record on grass compared to 210-219 (.490) on hard courts and 16-60 (.211) on clay.

[7] Holger Rune (DEN) vs Jordan Thompson (AUS)

First Meeting

Holger Rune | Age: 21 | World No. 15 | Career-High No. 4 | 2024: 22-12 (Brisbane Final) | Queen's: 3-1 (2023 SF)
 > Former World No. 1 junior broke into Top 100 in January 2022, Top 50 in May 2022 and Top 10 in November 2022, becoming highest-ranked Dane in PIF ATP Rankings history (since 1973), reaching No. 4 in August 2023.
 > Captured 2022 ATP Masters 1000 Paris title at age 19 by becoming 1st player since start of ATP Tour in 1990 to earn 5 Top-10 wins at an event other than Nitto ATP Finals.
 > From 2022 Paris to 2023 Rome, compiled an 18-5 record in 6 ATP Masters 1000 events, posting runner-up results in Monte Carlo (l. to Rublev) and Rome (l. to Medvedev).
 > Went on a 7-match winning streak vs. Top 5 opponents to record 7-1 start vs. Top 5 in career (now 7-10).
 > Ended 2022 season on 19-2 run (2-2 in finals) after going 1-6 from January-February and 0-7 from June-July.
 > Upset 2021 finalist Tsitsipas at 2022 Roland Garros to become 1st Danish man to reach QF in tournament history (since 1925) and to reach any Grand Slam QF in Open Era (since 1968).

NOTE: Rune is 10-1 in opening rounds this season (l. to Marozsan in ATP Masters 1000 Miami 2R) and owns a 16-3 record in tie-breaks this year. Went 7-2 on grass last season with runs to Queen's Club SF and Wimbledon QF.

Jordan Thompson | Age: 30 | World No. 43 | Career-High No. 32 | 2024: 16-14 (Los Cabos Title) | Queen's: 2-2 ('17, '23 2R)
 > Achieved career-high No. 32 in February 2024 after winning 1st ATP Tour title at age 29 in Los Cabos and becoming the 1st player to win singles and doubles title at same event since compatriot Kyrgios in 2022.
 > Earned personal-best 26 tour-level wins and broke into Top 50 in 2019, highlighted by ending 4-match losing streak in ATP Tour QFs by reaching 1st SF and final in 2019 's-Hertogenbosch.
 > Reached Grand Slam 4R for 1st time at 2020 US Open and ATP Masters 1000 4R for 1st time at 2019 Miami.
 > Upset World No. 1 and 5-time champion Murray at 2017 London/Queen's Club as LL, earning 1st tour-level win over Murray in 21 tries by an Aussie and No. 3 Tsitsipas at 2023 ATP Masters 1000 Indian Wells.
 > In 2018, went 1-11 on ATP Tour and 52-17 on ATP Challenger Tour (3-5 in finals), earning 2nd-most Challenger wins in a single season behind Berlocq's 57 wins in 2010.

NOTE: Thompson is 10-33 vs. Top 20 players, 2-7 on grass with wins over No. 1 Murray at Queen's Club in 2017 and No. 14 Ruud at 2021 Wimbledon. He aims to break a 5-match losing streak since defeating Munar in Barcelona.

Milos Raonic | Age: 33 | World No. 186 | Career-High No. 3 | 2024: 5-3 (2 QFs) | Queen's: 9-4 (2016 Final)
 > Ended 2016 at career-high No. 3 after earning personal-best 52 wins and reaching Nitto ATP Finals SF (l. to No. 1 Murray after holding 1 MP).
 > Became 1st Canadian to break into Top 10 in 2013, then won 1st All-Canadian final in Open Era at 2014 Washington (d. Pospisil).
 > Advanced to 10 Grand Slam QFs and 3 Grand Slam SFs, beating Federer in 5 sets to become 1st Canadian Grand Slam men's singles finalist at 2016 Wimbledon.
 > Earned biggest win of career over No. 2 Federer at 2014 Paris en route to 2nd of his 4 ATP Masters 1000 finals.
 > Played 85 tournaments and advanced to 7 finals since 8th and most recent ATP Tour title at 2016 Brisbane (d. Federer).

NOTE: Raonic is playing the event for the first time since reaching 2019 QF (5 appearances from 2015-19). He is 5-0 vs. players ranked outside Top 10 in 2024. Last week in 's-Hertogenbosch earned 1st grass ATP Tour QF since 2019.

Cameron Norrie | Age: 28 | World No. 39 | Career-High No. 8 | 2024: 14-11 (Rio SF) | Queen's: 6-6 (2021 Final)
 > Broke into Top 10 in April 2022 and achieved career-high No. 8 in September 2022, joining Henman, Murray and Rusedski as 4th Top-10 British man in history.
 > Advanced to 13 ATP Tour finals from May 2021-February 2023, highlighted by 2021 ATP Masters 1000 Indian Wells title to become 1st British champion in 46-year tournament history.
 > Reached Grand Slam 4R, QF and SF for 1st time at 2022 Wimbledon, falling to eventual champion Djokovic in 4 sets.
 > Earned 52 wins in 2021 and 49 wins in 2022 before beating No. 2 Nadal at 2023 United Cup and No. 2 Alcaraz in 2023 Rio de Janeiro final for biggest wins of career.

> Born in South Africa to a Scottish father and Welsh mother, grew up in New Zealand, became No. 1 collegiate player in USA at Texas Christian University, and has represented Great Britain since 2013.

NOTE: Norrie is making seventh consecutive appearance at the event, highlighted by runs to final in 2021 (l. to Berrettini) and QF last year (l. to Korda). He is 8-2 in his opening rounds of tour-level grass events since the start of 2019 season with lone 1R losses at Queen's Club in 2019 (l. to Anderson) and 2022 (l. to Dimitrov).

Alejandro Tabilo (CHI) vs Alejandro Davidovich Fokina (ESP) First Meeting

Alejandro Tabilo | Age: 27 | World No. 24 (Career-High) | 2024: 19-11 (Auckland Title) | Queen's: 0-1 (2021 1R)

> Toronto-born Chilean broke into Top 100 in February 2022, achieving career-high No. 24 in May 2024 soon after defeating No. 1 Djokovic for biggest win of career en route to 1st ATP Masters 1000 SF at 2024 Rome.

> Captured 1st ATP Tour title at 2024 Auckland as Q, becoming the 1st Chilean to win a title on hard courts since Gonzalez in 2007.

> Earned 6 straight-set wins – including 5 over Argentines – en route to 1st ATP Tour final at 2022 Cordoba as Q.

> Defeated countryman Garin en route to 2nd ATP Tour SF at 2022 Santiago as WC, then reached 2024 Santiago final.

> Qualified at Australian Open in 2020 and 2022, earning 5-set win over fellow South American Galan in Grand Slam main draw debut.

> Represented Canada throughout junior career, peaking at No. 29 in junior rankings during 2015 season.

NOTE: Tabilo is playing in his first grass tour-level event since 2022 Wimbledon. He owns a 1-4 record on the surface, defeating No. 57 Djere in 2022 Wimbledon 1R for lone win (0-3 vs. Top 50 on grass).
