ROTHESAY INTERNATIONAL – QUICK FACTS

[Q] Magda Linette (POL #46) vs. [8] Anastasia Pavlyuchenkova (#26) leads 2-0

First meeting between the two on grass courts... Linette is seeking her highest win-by-ranking since defeating No.18 Alexandrova in the R16 at Strasbourg 2024 ...Linette battled through qualifying to reach the main draw, defeating Wang Yafan and British player Ranah Akua Stoiber... Linette has never advanced past the Round of 16 at a grass court event before ... Pavlyuchenkova is playing her first match on grass since 2021, after missing all of 2022 due to injury and 2023 due to low ranking... Pavlyuchenkova has won all previous meetings with Linette in straight sets... Pavlyuchenkova is one of 10 grand slam singles finalists in the draw at Eastbourne (along with Rybakina, Ostapenko, Paolini, Keys, Krejcikova, Stephens, Raducanu, Fernandez, and Muchova)

Leylah Fernandez (CAN #30) vs. [7] Barbora Krejcikova (CZE #31)

First meeting between the pair on grass courts... **Fernandez** reached her best-ever result on grass last week, making the QF at Birmingham (I. eventual runner-up Tomljanovic) ... **Fernandez** looking for her best win-by-ranking since upsetting world No.8 Zheng at Doha 2024... **Fernandez** is also entered in doubles at Eastbourne with partner Ena Shibahara, where they will face No.2 seeds Laura Siegemund and **Krejcikova** in the first round... **Krejcikova** made the quarterfinals on Birmingham last week (I. Potapova); before this run, she had not won a match since she made the QF at Abu Dhabi in February... **Krejcikova** won the only prior meeting with Fernandez at the 2021 Olympics in Tokyo... **Krejcikova** has never won a grass-court tournament in singles, though she has won three in doubles (Birmingham 2023, Wimbledon 2022, Wimbledon 2018)

[WC] Harriet Dart (GBR #105) vs. Marie Bouzkova (CZE #37)

Dart will make her seventh showing at Eastbourne, where she was a quarterfinalist in 2022...Dart is a four-time grass-court quarterfinalist on tour, all coming in her home country of the United Kingdom...Dart's most recent Top 50 win came here in Eastbourne last year, over Zhang Shuai...Bouzkova is seeking her first Eastbourne win after first-round losses the last two years...Bouzkova has reached two grass-court quarterfinals on tour, including 2022 Wimbledon...Eastbourne has had a Czech champion three times in the last seven years (Ka. Pliskova in 2017 and 2019, and Kvitova in 2022)

[5] Jelena Ostapenko (LAT #13) vs. [Q] Greet Minnen (BEL #85)

Ostapenko defeated Minnen in the first round of Wimbledon last year...Ostapenko won nine straight matches at Eastbourne during 2021 and 2022, finishing as champion and runner-up respectively...Two of Ostapenko's eight career singles titles have come on grass...Ostapenko has won 23 matches this year, tied for eighth-best on tour...Minnen's sole Top 20 win came on grass, when she defeated former champion Garbiñe Muguruza at 2022 Wimbledon...Minnen qualified for the main draw after being an alternate into the qualifying draw...Belgians captured the Eastbourne title in 3 straight years: Kim Clijsters in 2005, and Justine Henin in 2006 and 2007

CAREER MILESTONES

- In 2023, earned third career title at Hong Kong (d. Siniakova). Prevented from a consecutive title run by Siniakova who defeated her in Nanchang SF. Other notable results where quarterfinals at Guadalajara (l. Kenin), Cleveland (l. Maria) and Auckland (l. Bonaventure). Also defeated Paolini at Billie Jean King Cup Finals to lift title with Canada.
- Broke into the Top 20 in doubles in 2023, after reaching final at Roland Garros, Miami (both w/Townsend) and Auckland (w/Mattek-Sands) as well as QF at US Open (w/Townsend).

In 2022 won her second title at Monterrey (d. Osorio in F; saved 5MP), and reached the QF at Roland Garros (l. Trevisan); missed grass-court season due to grade three stress fracture in her right foot suffered during match vs. Trevisan in Paris

- Enjoyed a memorable 2021 campaign, lifting first career title in Monterrey and advancing to maiden Grand Slam final, at US Open (l. Raducanu)
- En route to the final at Flushing Meadows in 2021, upset defending champion and No. 3 Osaka in 3r, 2016 winner Kerber in R16, No.5 Svitolina in QF and No. 2 Sabalenka in SF, becoming the youngest woman to beat multiple Top-5 opponents at the same major since S. Williams at 1999 US Open
- Breakout year in 2020 saw her crack Top 100 for the first time on September 14 and finish campaign by reaching 3r at Roland Garros
- Earned first career Grand Slam win at 2020 US Open (d. Zvonareva, l. Kenin in 2r) and made Grand Slam debut at 2020 Australian Open as qualifier (l. Davis in 1r)
- Reached first career WTA final and notched first tour-level back-to-back wins at 2020 Acapulco as qualifier (l. Watson in F); at 17y, 177d, she was the youngest Canadian to reach a WTA singles final in 34 years (since Helen Kelesi at 1986 Tokyo [Japan Open] won at 16y, 338d)
- Also in 2020, earned first Top-100 win over No.5 Bencic in Billie Jean King Cup
- Owns one singles title and two doubles titles on ITF Circuit
- Won 2019 Roland Garros junior's title (d. Navarro) becoming first Canadian to win a junior Grand Slam since Bouchard in 2012
- Played first WTA main draw and earned first main draw win of career at 2018 Quebec City defeating countrywoman Dabrowski in 1r (l. Watson in 2r)

- Reached four finals across 2023, winning first WTA 1000 title at Dubai (d. No.1 Swiatek in F) in addition to San Diego (d. Kenin in F), and finishing R-Up at Birmingham (l. Ostapenko) and Zhengzhou (l. Zheng Qinwen).
- Ended 2022 season in fine form, lifting back-toback titles at Tallinn (d. Kontaveit) and Ostrava (d. Swiatek). Also completed career doubles Slam by winning US Open w/Siniakova.
- Made strong start to 2022, finishing R-Up at Sydney (l. Badosa) and reaching QF at Australian Open (l. Keys) before missing several months w/arm injury.
- Lifted maiden WTA title at 2021 Strasbourg, followed by sweep of singles and doubles titles at Roland-Garros. Roland Garros was just her fifth Slam main draw in singles; only two women have won a major with fewer main draw appearances to their name.
- Also won Prague title (d. Martincova in F), reached final at Dubai (l. Muguruza) and qualified for WTA Finals in singles for the first time. Recorded best results at US Open (QF) and Wimbledon (R16) last year
- Posted another record-breaking year in doubles across 2021 - in addition to singles title at Roland Garros, won doubles title too in Paris, along with Madrid, Gippsland Trophy, WTA Finals and the gold medal at Tokyo 2020 Olympic Games (all w/Siniakova)
- Enjoyed breakout year in singles in 2020, posting career-high ranking of No.65 (November 16) and making R16 at Roland Garros and reaching second WTA SF at Linz
- Also reached two doubles finals last year, finishing R-Up at Dubai (w/Zheng) and winning Shenzhen (w/Siniakova)
- In Mixed Doubles, defended Australian Open title (w/Pavic), having triumphed in Melbourne a year earlier with w/Ram
- In 2019, advanced to QF at Bucharest in addition to winning four ITF Circuit singles titles on clay in North America and Europe, winning 20 of her 21 matches during this stretch
- Also in 2019, posted second Top 20 doubles season highlighted by titles at Toronto and Linz, and R-Up finish at Indian Wells (all w/Siniakova). Won Australian Open mixed doubles title w/Ram
- In 2018, won first two Grand Slam trophies at Roland Garros (d. Hozumi/ Ninomiya in F) and Wimbledon (d. Melichar/Peschke in F) both w/Siniakova, the first pairing to complete the Roland Garros-Wimbledon double since Kim Clijsters and Ai Sugiyama in 2003; also became

- Member of Canadian Billie Jean King Cup Team 2019, 2021-22
- Made professional debut on ITF Circuit in USA in 2016

the first team ever to win the girls' (2013) and ladies' doubles title at SW19

- Rose to WTA doubles World No.1 on October 22, 2018
- Highlight of 2017 was R-Up finish in first WTA singles final at Nürnberg (l. Bertens in F). Also made QF as qualifier at Bastad (l. Garcia). Only other tour-level appearances were 1r exits at Bucharest and Québec City
- Contested five WTA main draws in 2016, progressing to 2r at two events: Kuala Lumpur and Prague
- Lifted maiden WTA doubles title at 2015 Québec City (w/Mestach)
- Advanced to first WTA doubles final at 2014 Luxembourg (w/Hradecka, l. Bacsinszky/Barrois)
- Reached 2r on WTA debut as qualifier at 2014 Québec City (l. Hradecka)
- On ITF Circuit, owns 14 singles and 19 doubles titles
- Made professional debut at \$10K ITF/Piestany-SVK in 2010




