MATCH NOTES - DAY 4 - THURSDAY, JUNE 27, 2024

Katie Boulter (GBR #32) vs. [3] Jasmine Paolini (ITA #7)

Boulter leads 2-1

Fourth meeting between the pair... **Boulter** seeking her second grass semifinal (along with Nottingham) and third overall (San Diego) of 2024... **Boulter** notched her sixth career Top 20 win yesterday by defeating World No.13 Jelena Ostapenko. Three of her six Top 20 wins have come on grass... The only other time three British players (**Boulter**, Dart, Raducanu) made the quarterfinals at Eastbourne in the same year was Anne Hobbs, Virginia Wade and Michelle Tyler in 1974... **Boulter** leads the matchup between the pair, but the last two tour meetings have been split, with **Boulter** defeating **Paolini** most recently in Linz... **Paolini** received her first maindraw grass court win in the previous round via a retirement from opponent Elise Mertens... **Paolini** has a 9-10 record in Tour-level quarterfinal matches

[6] Daria Kasatkina (#14) vs. [WC] Emma Raducanu (GBR #168)

Kasatkina leads 1-0

Second meeting, and the first on grass courts... **Kasatkina** is seeking her second consecutive appearance in the Eastbourne semifinals (she made the final here last year, losing to Madison Keys)...**Kasatkina** is seeking her fourth semifinal of 2024 (after Adelaide, Abu Dhabi, and Charleston), where she has a perfect 3-0 record... **Kasatkina** has reached the Eastbourne quarterfinals for the fourth time in her career... **Raducanu** won her first match over a Top 10 player in the previous round, defeating World No.5 Jessica Pegula in three sets (was previously 0-7 and 0-14 in sets)... **Raducanu** saved match point in the second set against Pegula... With **Raducanu**'s win over Pegula, she joined Katie Boulter and Harriet Dart to have three British players in the Eastbourne quarterfinals for the first time since 1974 (Anne Hobbs, Virginia Wade and Michelle Tyler)... **Raducanu** seeking just the fourth semifinal of her career; made the semifinal two weeks ago at Nottingham

[WC] Harriet Dart (GBR #105) vs. Leylah Fernandez (CAN #30)

Dart leads 1-0

Second meeting...Dart is making her seventh main draw appearance at Eastbourne (eighth overall)...Dart is playing the tournament with as a wildcard and has beaten Marie Bouzkova and Sofia Kenin to reach the quarterfinal, which equals her previous best result at Eastbourne in 2022 (QF, I. eventual champion Kvitova)...A win today would be Dart's first Top 30 win of 2024 season, having failed all of her previous meetings against such opponents - I. No.25 Krejcikova at Birmingham, No.30 Boulter at Nottingham, No. 29 Noskova at Roland Garros....Dart is looking to her first career SF on grass... Fernandez is making tournament debut...Fernandez has beaten Barbora Krejcikova and Ashlyn Krueger so far this week to reach back-to-back quarterfinals after Birmingham (I. eventual R-Up Tomljanovic), which are her career best results on grass... Fernandez's record against opponents outside Top 100 stands at 4-1 in 2024, with the only loss to No. 190 Tomljanovic at Birmingham last week...With a win today, Fernandez would become the first Canadian woman to reach the semifinal at Eastbourne since Aleksandra Wozniak did so in 2009

Keys leads 1-0

After a bye, defending champion **Keys** has won her opening match against Anhelina Kalinina to reach the quarterfinal, extending her winning streak at Eastbourne to six matches... **Keys** is making fifth main-draw appearance at Eastbourne (6th overall), also winning the tournament in 2014 (d. Kerber)...**Keys** has played today's opponent **Muchova** once at Beijing 2019 and won...**Keys**' record in WTA quarterfinal matches stands at 2-1 in 2024 (27-19 in career), and is looking to reach her third SF of the season after Strasbourg (en route to the title) and Madrid... **Muchova** is making tournament debut at Eastbourne... **Muchova** has just come back to the Tour after injury and is playing her first tournament since US Open 2023... **Muchova** hold a win percentage of 74.5% at WTA Events since the start of the 2023 season... **Muchova's** record in WTA quarterfinal matches stands at 7-8, with the most recent QF match coming at US Open 2023 (d. Cirstea)... **Muchova's** best career results on grass are quarterfinal runs at Wimbledon 2021 and 2019

CAREER MILESTONES

- In 2023 captured first WTA singles title of career on home soil at Nottingham; made Top 50 debut at No.50 the week of September 11; advanced to 3r at Wimbledon for second year in a row (l. Rybakina), and at US Open for first time (l. Stearns).
- Also in 2023, reached 2r as qualifier at both Montreal and Beijing; on ITF Circuit won one singles title at Canberra and reached two finals in Japan; went 2-0 in singles in November's Billie Jean King Cup play-offs against Sweden
- During the 2022 grass court season, advanced to QF at Nottingham (ret. vs. Davis w/right elbow injury) and 2r at Wimbledon (l. Sabalenka)
- Opened 2021 season by reaching 3r at the Gippsland Trophy in Melbourne (l. Osaka); upset No.14 seed Gauff in 2r
- Ended 2020 by finishing R-Up at \$15k ITF/Sharm El-Sheikh-EGY. Earlier in the year, made 2r at Acapulco (l. Zhu) and fell 1r at Australian Open (l. Svitolina) in only Tour-level outings
- Suffered a stress fracture in her back which forced her out for much of 2019. Best results prior to injury were 2r showing at Australian Open and SF run at \$25K ITF/Solapur-IND (l. Raina)
- Won the WTA's first-ever 10-point match tiebreak at a Slam to see off Makarova in 1r at 2019 Australian Open
- Reached career-high No.82 on February 18, 2019
- Broke into the Top 100 the week of October 15, 2018
- Made significant strides in 2018, reaching first WTA QF of career at Nottingham (l. eventual champion Barty) - defeated Stosur en route for her first win over a Grand Slam winner. Also enjoyed QF run at Tianjin (d. No.432 Sakkari, l. Ka.Pliskova) and R-Up finish at \$100K ITF/Southsea-GBR (l. Flipkens)
- Also in 2018, reached 2r for the first time at a major, at Wimbledon (d. Cepede Royg, l. Osaka)
- Part of Great Britain Fed Cup Team, 2018-19
- Fell 1r on tour level main draw singles debut at 2017 Wimbledon (as WC, l. McHale)
- On ITF Circuit, winner of six singles titles and four doubles titles
- Played first professional events of career on ITF Circuit in Britain in 2011
- Appeared in girls' singles at all four Slams, reaching 3r at Australian Open, Wimbledon and US Open, and was R-Up in doubles at 2014 Australian Open (w/Jorovic, l. Kalinina/Kulichkova). Other junior highlights include winning Lemon Bowl in Rome at age of

- Finished 2023 by breaking into Top 30 for first time, achieving No. 29 on Oct 23, 2023 after becoming runner-up at Monastir (l. Mertens).
 Also achieved runner-up at Palermo and SF at Zhengzhou (l. Zheng both times) as well as QFs at Lyon (l. Garcia) and Cincinnati as a qualifier (l. eventual champion Gauff). Enjoyed two Top 10 wins (No.10 Garcia and No.4 Rybakina).
- In 2022, finished R-Up at Cluj-Napoca (l. Blinkova), while made back-to-back SF at Palermo (l. Bronzetti) and Warsaw (l. eventual champion Garcia)
- Also reached QF at Lyon (l. Yastremska), Portoroz (l. eventual champion Siniakova) and Parma (l. Kovinic)
- Broke into Top 50 on January 31, 2021
- Posted near-Top 50 season finish in 2021 after capturing first WTA singles title of career at Portoroz (d. Riske in F)
- Strong season finish also brought SF run at Courmayeur(l. eventual champion Vekic) and QF effort at Linz (l. Halep); posted best win of season over No.18 Mertens en route to 3r at Indian Wells (l. Pegula)
- Also in 2021 won the WTA 125K event in Bol, Croatia (d. Rus in F) and was R-Up at the same level in Saint Malo (l. Golubic) Captured first WTA doubles title in 2021, at Hamburg(w/Teichmann)
- In 2021, for first time in career, contested the full suite of all four Grand Slam events; reached 2r at Roland Garros and USOpen, equalling best previous Slam result
- In 2020, reached 2r four times at WTA tournaments, including Roland Garros (l. Kvitova)
- Highlights of 2019 included QF showings at Guangzhou and Palermo, a SF run at the WTA 125K Series event at Karlsruhe, lifting seventh, eighth and ninth ITF Circuit titles of her career, at \$60KBrescia-ITA, \$25K ITF/Curtiba-BRA and \$100K ITF/Tokyo-JPN, and qualifying for maiden Grand Slam main draw at Roland Garros (l. Kasatkina in 1r)
- Ended 2018 ranked No.180, with season highlight a maiden WTA singles QF at Prague (d. No.15 Kasatkina, l. Zhang)
- Made WTA main draw debut at 2017 Bastad (l. Suarez Navarro in 1r) and also fell 1r at Guangzhou and in qualifying a further three times
- Part of Italy's Billie Jean King Cup team 2017-19
- Made WTA qualifying debut at 2015 Rome




