

THE STORY SO FAR...

After two days of action at Manchester's AO Arena, France and Great Britain top Group B thanks to impressive wins against Switzerland and Australia.

Group leaders France got the week underway with a 3-0 victory over 2014 champions Switzerland. Adrian Mannarino and Ugo Humbert wrapped up the tie with back-to-back singles wins over Dominic Stricker and Stan Wawrinka, before experienced doubles duo Eduoard Roger-Vasselin and Nicola Mahut completed the clean sweep.

Jack Draper and Dan Evans led Great Britain to a 2-1 victory against 2022 runners-up Australia to kick-start their campaign with a win.

Making his Davis Cup debut for the Brits, Draper came from a set down to beat Thanasi Kokkinakis 6-7(6), 6-3, 7-6(4) in almost three hours. Then it was over to Evans, who clinched his best career Davis Cup victory over world No.12 Alex De Minaur 6-1, 2-6, 6-4.

Australia secured a lifeline in the final doubles rubber as Matthew Ebden and Max Purcell defeated Evans and Neal Skupski 7-6(5), 6-4. They will need to beat France today if they want to keep their qualification hopes alive.

Last season's runners-up and the second most decorated team in Davis Cup history – Australia come into the Davis Cup Finals as one of the teams to beat.

In 2022, the Australians qualified from Group C, before defeating Netherlands and Croatia en route to the final. They eventually finished runners-up to Canada, but by reaching the final, they automatically gained qualification to this year's Group Stage.

Australia head to Manchester with a strong team – led by world No.12 and last month's National Bank Open runner-up Alex de Minaur – and will be looking to go one step further this year and lift their 29th team title.

France will be a tough test for every team in Group B as they head to Manchester with all five players ranking inside the singles or doubles top 50.

Earlier this year, the French side came through a tricky qualifier against Hungary – overturning a 2-1 deficit to win the final two singles matches and take the tie 3-2.

Ugo Humbert and Adrian Mannarino have been in good form this season, while 19-year-old Arthur Fils is one to watch for the future, having made an impressive start to life on the ATP Tour.

They have some recent history with fellow members of Group B – Australia – who defeated the French team at this stage last year as they went on to make the final. Similarly, they faced Great Britain in the 2021 Finals, losing 2-1 on the day, so they will have plenty to prove at the AO Arena.



SERVING UP GREAT PLACES TO PLAY TENNS





Through its Park Tennis Project, the LTA is giving a new lease of life to thousands of tennis courts across Britain.

The Davis Cup is taking place at a time when the LTA is refurbishing thousands of park tennis courts across the country as part of a joint £30million investment by the UK Government and LTA Tennis Foundation.

The LTA has been working with Manchester City Council and local authorities across Greater Manchester to upgrade facilities and help people pick up a racket and play with £1.7million already invested into 40 parks with tennis courts across Greater Manchester, with more to come.

The project is the biggest investment in parks tennis courts across Britain for a generation, through which the LTA and UK Government want to inspire half a million more people to give tennis a go.

The LTA is also supporting local authorities and providers to ensure that a range of activity is in place across refurbished park courts - so we can open up the sport to people of all backgrounds. This includes free weekly tennis sessions where equipment will be provided, meaning anyone can turn up and play entirely cost free.
