

THE STORY SO FAR...


It's all to play for in Group B at the Davis Cup Finals in Manchester, with Great Britain, France and Australia having won one tie each with just three left to go.

The Brits face Switzerland off the back of a 2-1 win over 2022 runners-up Australia – thanks to heroics from Davis Cup debutant Jack Draper as well as Dan Evans' biggest win in the competition against Alex De Minaur.

Yesterday, the Australian team came from a match down to beat France 2-1, which means that all four teams can still qualify for the Final 8.

Switzerland got off to a slow start against the French team, losing 3-0 in their opener, but with the likes of three-time Grand Slam champion Stan Wawrinka and rising stars Leandro Riedi and Dominic Stricker in the team, they will be a tough challenge for the Brits.



Great Britain come into the Davis Cup Finals in Manchester off the back of an impressive 3-1 win over Colombia back in April. Lexus GB Davis Cup Team Captain and LTA Head of Men's Tennis Leon Smith has selected a team balanced with experienced champions and rising stars as they bid to reach the knockout stage in Malaga in November.

Two members of the 2015 title-winning team, Dan Evans and Andy Murray join a star-studded line-up, alongside British No.1 Cam Norrie and doubles world No.3 Neal Skupski. 21-year-old Jack Draper comes in as the fifth member of the squad fresh off the back of a career-best fourth round at the US Open - giving Smith a range of options to choose from across the three ties.

Switzerland caused one of the upsets of the qualifying rounds for this year's Davis Cup Finals as they knocked out fifth ranked team in the world Germany 3-2 in an away tie in February. The team are set to play in the Finals Group Stage for the first time in its tournament's new format.

This year's team will be headed by three-time Grand Slam champion Stan Wawrinka, who joins forces with Marc-Andrea Huesler and ATP Next Gen star Dominc Stricker. Wawrinka was a key part of the 2014 team - alongside Roger Federer - who made history in winning Switzerland's first ever Davis Cup title.







SERVING UP GREAT PLACES TO PLAY TENNIS



Through its Park Tennis Project, the LTA is giving a new lease of life to thousands of tennis courts across Britain.

The Davis Cup is taking place at a time when the LTA is refurbishing thousands of park tennis courts across the country as part of a joint £30million investment by the UK Government and LTA Tennis Foundation.

The LTA has been working with Manchester City Council and local authorities across Greater Manchester to upgrade facilities and help people pick up a racket and play with £1.7million already invested into 40 parks with tennis courts across Greater Manchester, with more to come.

The project is the biggest investment in parks tennis courts across Britain for a generation, through which the LTA and UK Government want to inspire half a million more people to give tennis a go.

The LTA is also supporting local authorities and providers to ensure that a range of activity is in place across refurbished park courts - so we can open up the sport to people of all backgrounds. This includes free weekly tennis sessions where equipment will be provided, meaning anyone can turn up and play entirely cost free.
