COMPETITION FRAMEWORK















LOCAL TOUR

Team Challenge is a great way to introduce kids to competition.

It's local, fun and you play as part of a team.

The LTA Youth League is a team competition run across all junior age groups (8U to 18U).

You get given a fixture list of matches to play against other venues in your area. You play both singles and doubles matches with your friends.


Matchplay is often your first experience of individual competition.

You will play some singles matches in a non-elimination format and at least one doubles for fun.

Local Tour is a quick scoring tournament format.

Everyone will get a number of singles matches and we will find an overall winner.











LOCAL COMPETITIONS

Local Tennis Leagues – friendly singles competitions for adults, held nationwide on park and public courts.

Matchplays – competitions for juniors and adults, providing match practice against players of a similar ability.

Local Tour – a range of tournaments giving players the opportunity to earn LTA Ranking or Recent Form points. Half day events for 8U & 9U players, possibly increasing to a full day for 10U -18U, and medals up for grabs!



COUNTY & REGIONAL TOURNAMENTS

County Tour - play regular tournaments and take on a wide variety of opponents. Events for players from 9U - Adult, most are run over 1-day.

County Championships – thousands of players of all ages and abilities come together on the last week in August to compete against players from their county to be crowned county champion.

Regional Tour – a series of tournaments at some of the best regional venues across the country. Most of the Regional Tour takes place as 2–4-day events.



NATIONAL & INTERNATIONAL TOURNAMENTS

National Tour – a series of junior tournaments giving the best young players in the country the chance to compete against each other.

British Tour – a series of tournaments for professional players wanting to compete on home soil, young stars with ambitions of going pro in the future, and national level players who still compete at a high level.

International Events – junior and adult Tournaments that are part of the ITF World Tennis Tour, ITF World Tennis Tour Junior circuit or the Tennis Europe Junior Tour.



TEAM CHALLENGE

WHY DELIVER TEAM CHALLENGE?

RETAIN MORE PLAYERS AT YOUR VENUE AND COACHING PROGRAMMES

Players that take part in fun, team competition play tennis for longer and more often throughout their lives = more players staying within the game at your venue and in your coaching programmes

Over 45,000 players took part in Team Challenge in 2022 because:

- There's less pressure when playing with friends and it's a good chance to make new pals!

- Win, lose or draw, all players receive a sticker and certificate, with a lucky few picking up a medal and prizes

Match Week slots directly not your weekly coaching programmes – every 6th week.

Match Week is a great way to provide an appropriate, fun, competitive experience to your players

No additional organisation.

FESTIVALS

The ultimate fun, team tennis competition!

Festivals are events that take place outside of the coaching programme – at weekends or during school holidays

You can run a festival just for the players at your venue, or invite other venues and players if you wish

Every Festival has it's own **theme** and is designed to be delivered at a certain time of year

LTAYOUTH LEAGUE AND LTANATIONAL LEAGUE

LTA YOUTH LEAGUE

- Singles based team competition for LTA registered venues.
- Provides recreational players in 8U 18U age groups with regular league matches against players of a similar standard in a competitive team environment.
- Excellent way for venues to attract and retain players.
- Summer season runs from April-July and the Winter season from Sept-Mar (venues can enter one or both seasons)
- LTA Youth Leagues take place in every county, with local league organisers administering the leagues
- The summer season **closes for entries on 14**th **February** (majority of leagues will remain open until end of Feb)

LTA NATIONAL LEAGUE

- Primarily a singles-based team competition for LTA registered venues.
- Provides players of all ages and abilities with regular league matches against players of a similar standard in a competitive team environment.
- Excellent way for venues to attract and retain players.
- Different tiers across the competition that culminate in a National Finals.
- Venues can enter teams from 8U through to Over 75's. There are Men's and Women's events and a Padel league.
- Summer season runs from April-July and the Winter season from Sept-Mar (venues can enter one or both seasons)
- The summer season **closes for entries on 14th February** (majority of leagues will remain open until end of Feb)

PLAY YOUR WAY TO WIND WAY AND WAY WAY TO WAY

PLAY YOUR WAY TO WIMBLEDON

- The Play Your Way to Wimbledon, powered by Vodafone, tournament gives players an opportunity to follow in their heroes footsteps and compete for the title at Wimbledon.
- Players start by competing locally at an event taking place at a club, park or school with the winners progressing to the County and/or Area Finals, and then on to the National Finals at Wimbledon.
- LTA Registered venues can run an event exclusively for their members, or they can open up their venue and invite all local players to take part.
- There are a number of different events that venues can chose to run:
 - 14U Singles Boys and Girls
 - 18U Doubles Boys and Girls
 - Adult Doubles Men and Women
- Players must have an ITF World Tennis Number between 23.0 and 40.9 to take part.
- Venues receive a free organiser pack to help them stage their event





PLAY YOUR WAY TO WIMBLEDON - DISABILITY EVENTS

- In 2024 there will be a Play Your Way to Wimbledon Disability Pathway with Wheelchair, Visually Impaired and Learning Disability events.
- Competitions are hosted as part of Regional Series Tournaments (Singles) held between January and May 2024
- There are 2-4 Regional Series Tournaments for players to complete in across the following categories: Wheelchair (men's and women's), Visually Impaired (men's and women's, B1, B2, B3, B4-5) and Learning Disability (mixed).
- The Winners and Runners Up from each event are then invited to compete in the National Finals at Wimbledon from 11 – 17 August 2024.

LTA YOUTH MATCHPLAYS

LTA YOUTH MATCHPLAY

A super flexible matchplay product for all junior grade 6 competition that can be delivered by coaches, competition organisers and officials for internal players (just those that normally play at the venue) and/or external players. Results must be submitted, via TTP or Results Manager, to count towards LTA Youth Compete rewards.

- Provide internal competition at your venue just for your players –

THE PRACTICAL DETAILS

- Results must be submitted to count towards LTA Youth Compete rewards for the players – this can be done via CMS/TTP or Results Manager
- If you want to learn more about LTA Youth Compete competitions, including matchplays, you can complete the online training module -LTA Youth Compete – credits available for coaches and officials
- Once you have completed the online LTA Youth Compete training you can apply for an LTA Youth Compete organiser pack containing an LTA Youth Compete sweatshirt, clipboard, posters, stickers, certificates and an organiser guide.

LTA YOUTH LOCAL TOUR & LTA COUNTY TOUR

LTA YOUTH LOCAL TOUR

Local Tour offers a range of tournaments throughout the year for children aged 18 & under.

These competitions are Grade 5 events and give players their first opportunity to earn real Recent Form* or LTA Ranking points.

For players aged 9 & under, these tournaments normally last half a day and use a simple format – one match tiebreak to 1- points for players competing with an orange or red ball.

For players aged 10-18 it could still be half a day or ramp up to a full day. Then it's time for FAST4 scoring!

Competitions will try and take as many players as they can, but numbers are limited so players will be taken on a 'first come, first served' basis. Entries will be accepted until the draw is full.

Venues can run LTA Youth Local Tour competitions as long as they have the court availability (for 10U – 18U events four courts will be needed) and an LTA Licensed Referee to run the competition.

*Recent Form is a measure used for 9U and 10U players – it is calculated using your best 3 individual performances (at a specific ball colour) in Grade 1-5 competitions over the past 6 months. Recent form is used for acceptance into 9U and 10U events in Grade 1-4 competitions



LTA COUNTY TOUR

County Tour offers a range of tournaments throughout the year in 9U to Adult age groups.

These competitions are Grade 4 events and are a good progression for players who have been competing in LTA Youth Local Tour competitions and are ready for their next challenge.

As well as Singles events there are Doubles events in the 11U – 18U age groups.

Acceptance is based on Recent Form for 9U and 10U events, LTA Ranking for 11U – 18U events and ITF World Tennis Number for Adult events.

Venues can run LTA County Tour competitions as long as they have the court availability (for 10U – Adult events four courts will be needed) and an LTA Licensed Referee to run the competition.

RESULTS MANAGER

RESULTS MANAGER

The LTA Results Manager tool helps Organisers, Officials and Coaches easily record results when running internal competitions at their venue.

You can submit results from your venue competitions directly to the LTA from your mobile phone or tablet. Results will immediately appear on all Players' profiles in the system and feed through to the ITF World Tennis Number.

The tool is quick and easy to use and players linked to your venue will appear in the system ready for you to select and record the results of their matches.

Access to the tool is free for LTA registered venues.

BOX LEAGUE MANAGER

BOX LEAGUE MANAGER

Box League Manager is a fantastic, easy-to-use tool that is available free of charge to all LTA registered venues.

Venues can use Box League Manager to run internal box league competitions for players at their venue.

Box leagues can be set up so that players can enter online, view their box and opponents and submit their match results, reducing the admin burden for the box league organiser.

Venues can charge an entry fee, or run their box leagues free of charge for their members.

BOX LEAGUES GO FROM STRENGTH!

Players competing in club's singles leagues increase by 150% David Lloyd Club Renfrew

The Renfrew club has seen a rapid growth in the number of members competing in their singles box leagues.

This has resulted in the club gaining new, and retaining, members Inis has resulted in the club gaining new, and retaining, member as they enjoy both the tennis experience and the social aspect of it. There have been 2 key elements that has brought about this tennis experience.

- the Management team engaging with myself, the volunteer that runs the box leagues
- the release of the LTA Software Box League Manager (BLM)







WHERE THE BOX LEAGUES STARTED FROM

My first box league started in 2011 with 12 players. Since then, I have run a number of box leagues (and various other events) at the club. However due to lack of support and promotion from the club, the numbers typically stayed around the 30 to 40 level at its peak. This meant there were so many players missing out and resulting in many new tennis members joining but not staying as a member for long.

WHAT WAS DONE

This time last year the club's relatively new general manager asked for a meeting as he had heard that I was running box leagues and occasional tournaments for the members as a volunteer. Instead of being negative, he was very supportive and asked me to officially help out at the club, still as a volunteer, with box leagues and internal competition. This gave me the incentive and encouragement needed to expand the tennis experience and network at the club.


I created a Clubspark website to help improve communication, made more use of the club's notice board and Facebook group, liaised with the coaches for them to promote the leagues and actively spoke to the tennis members who were playing 'bounce' matches. These alone resulted in a 100% increase in both numbers of players involved and number of matches played. However, this success also had a drawback.


I was doing all of the leagues manually in TTP, which although a great software tool for competitions, was taking up so much of my time. I was getting loads of texts and emails from players asking to join, having to look up their LTA Advantage number, adding them in to TTP and recording over 200 results. This would be required for every round. This, along with running other events, was not sustainable in the long term. This was where the 2nd key element would become crucial if the new success of the box leagues were to continue.

Welcome to Box League Manager, the new Software released by the LTA. As with any new system there were teething issues and a number of enhancements fed back to get released in future. However, this new system has resulted in all players entering online and recording their own results, which cut down on the admin considerably. After each round, the Software also makes it so easy to place players in their new groups if they were promoted, relegated, or added. To ensure the use of the app was a success, I added instructions to the Clubspark website on how to join the LTA (for free), affiliate to our club, join the box league and enter results.

The new box league, that has just started this week, has 98 players entered playing across 7 groups. No interested player gets refused. The leagues are there for all standards and all adult ages.

FRIENDLY, COMPETITIVE TENNIS ON A COURT NEAR YOU!

Local Tennis Leagues is based mostly in parks and includes mixed singles leagues for adults aged 18+.

Play your tennis, your way, and join thousands of players in hundreds of Leagues across the UK. LTL helps build a sense of community, puts local players in touch with each other, and gives players a way to improve their tennis.

Players sign up online, once entered into a league they will be matched with 6-8 players of their standard, and they arrange their matches when and where they like, sharing any court fees with their opponents.

Members of venues may wish to join to access more singles competition and venues with public/pay-to-use courts may wish to consider adding their venue to a league.

PADEL COMPETITION

PADEL COMPETITION

Padel's an innovative form of tennis that's fun, easy to learn and extremely sociable. Played on an enclosed court about a third the size of a tennis court, groups of mixed ages and abilities can play together.

There are Padel competitions for everyone – whether you are a seasoned pro or have only just picked up a bat.

Local Padel Leagues – friendly, competitive padel competitions for everyone. When you enter a league you'll be organised into a group with players of a similar standard, you then arrange matches at a time and location to suit you.

Grade 5 – Local Tour – The perfect introduction to graded competition for new or experienced players. It's local, first come first served acceptance with eight players competing in a compass draw.

Grade 4 – County Tour – If you want to compete against different players at different venues the County Tour is ideal. Acceptance to these events is based on the LTA Padel Rankings and competitions have a round robin to elimination format.

Grade 3 – Regional Tour – These competitions are perfect if you know your way around the court, have experience of competing and want to keep improving your game.

ITF WORLD TENNIS NUMBER AND SELF SUBMISSION OF RESULTS

The ITF World Tennis Number is a new rating system for all tennis players across the world which will make it easier for everyone who plays tennis in Britain to organiser and play against opponents of a similar standard.

The ITF World Tennis Number has:

- A world-wide system that ranges from 40 (recreational players) to 1 (pro players)
- Separate ratings for singles and doubles
- An algorithm that produces your own rating
- An algorithm that counts sets, and matches, played which means the more you compete, the more accurate your rating will be
- A personalised digital 'Game zONe' feature, which will help you identify opponents with a similar rating online
- The facility for players to upload their own match results after they've played

SUPPORTING THE DELIVERY OF TENNIS COMPETITION

There are a number of ways people can support the delivery of competition at their tennis venue, with training and support available to everyone.

Competition Organiser

Competition Organisers can help to run and organise competitions at a recreational level. To become a Competition Organiser you will need to attend a three-hour online course – this will help you with the basics of running local Grade 6, Grade 7 and ungraded events.

Tennis Referee

Tennis referees are responsible for looking after all players at a competition and making sure everyone is following the rules of the game. To become a referee you must complete and pass a two-day course. If you pass you'll be able to run Grade 4, 5, 6 and 7 competitions.

Court Supervisor

Court Supervisors help to make sure competitions run as smoothly as possible. They support referees in running larger competitions and look after a number of courts to ensure everyone is having the best possible experience. Anyone over the age of 16 can become a Court Supervisor – you just have to complete a free online course.

What is the Parent Support Programme?

Parents play a key role in sport and kids need their support and encouragement.

We work closely with sports psychology experts from Loughborough University and the University of Roehampton to offer help – what we call the Parent Support Programme.

In the Summer of 2023 we will also be launching a new Parenting Support module for parents with children that are new to competition. This online module will be available for parents to complete in their own time and will help them understand the Competition Pathway, learn how to find an appropriate competition for their child, know what to expect at competitions and how to best support their child when they are competing.

LTA YOUTH COMPETE REWARDS
